The Nature of Geographical Knowledge in Hittite Anatolia in the 18th – 12th Centuries BCE in the Light of Cuneiform Sources

The talk will discuss a new, three-year project that is about to start at the University of Warsaw. It's aim is to investigate selected aspects of the – broadly speaking – Hittite perception of the world on the basis of the original Hittite cuneiform texts. It is organized into five subsequent partial (sub)investigations:

- 1. Understanding Hittite space and place. Distribution and function of Hittite geographical determinatives.
- 2. The structure and function of borders and border descriptions.
- 3. Itineraries and the problem of distance.
- 4. Geographical horizon and the role of space and territorial expansion in the royal ideology.
- 5. Geography in Hittite epic and myth.
